Notes for Judges:

- **Supporting Evidence**: Look for relevant facts, examples, or anecdotes that effectively back up the essay's argument or main points.
- **Topic Development**: Evaluate the writer's ability to thoroughly explore and analyze the topic within the essay's scope.
- **Originality**: Reward essays that show a fresh perspective or creative approach, avoiding clichés or overly common ideas.
- **Grammar/Spelling/Mechanics**: Consider whether errors distract from the readability, but do not penalize minor issues if the overall writing is strong.
- Overall Organization: Assess how well the essay flows, including its logical progression and clarity.
